Was born in Chicago in 1862, where he received his early training at the Institute, and has since studied abroad with such masters as Delance, Gallot, Lefebvre and Courtois.

Mr. Ertz has received numerous medals and awards among which are :

Gold Medal at International Exhibition at St. Etienne France, 1895.

Gold Medal at Ville D'Angiers, 1896.

Grand Prize at Rouen, 1896.

Bronze Medal from the Societe des Amis des Arts France.

Gold Medal at Ville D'Elboul, 1897.

Three awards at the Arts and Crafts Exhibition at Bristol, Eng.

Bronze Medal at Philadelphia, 1904.

Elected to Membership of the Royal British Art Association, 1901.

Elected an associate of the Society of Illustrators, New York, London and Paris.

Mr. Ertz has become a permanent resident at Polperro Cornwall, England—and a number of the canvasses shown at this exhibition are interesting spots near his home.
