¶ Charles Morris Young was born at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, in 1869. He studied at the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts under Robert Vonnoh, and in Paris under Prinnet and Girardot.

¶ He was awarded the Toppan Prize and an Honorable Mention by the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, Honorable Mention at the Pan-American Exposition, Buffalo, 1901; a Silver Medal at the Charleston Exposition, 1902, and a Silver Medal at the Universal Exposition, St. Louis, 1904. Pictures by him have been purchased by the Hungarian National Gallery at Budapest, the Permanent Collection of the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, the Boston Art Club, and by the artists, William M. Chase and Alexander Harrison. Mr. Young is a member of the Paris-American Art Association, the Philadelphia Art Club, etc.
