OLIVER DENNETT GROVER

was born in Earlville, Illinois, 1861. He was a pupil of Frank Duveneck in Florence and in Venice; later, studied in the Royal Academy of Munich, and afterwards under Boulanger, Lefebvre and Laurens in Paris. In 1892, Mr. Grover received the first Yerkes Prize in Chicago. At the St. Louis World's Fair, in 1904, he was awarded silver and bronze medals. He has also received the Fine Arts Prize of the Society of Western Artists, and the Young Fortnightly Prize, Chicago, 1909. ¶ Mr. Grover is represented in the City Art Museum, St. Louis; Museum of Fine Arts, Detroit; Art Institute, Chicago; Union League Club, Chicago; Indianapolis Club, Indianapolis. He is a member and ex-president of the Society of Western Artists; likewise, a member and ex-president of the Chicago Society of Artists.
