# ANNOUNCEMENT

The Trustees of the Detroit Museum of Art this year begin an Annual Exhibition of the works of American artists. Only artists of established reputation are represented, whether by direct contributions from the painters themselves or by loans from private owners. Every picture in the collection has distinct merit, although of course some canvases make a wider appeal than others.

The time of the Exhibition has been arranged so as to take advantage of the opportunities for selection from such well-established annual exhibitions as those of the National Academy of Design, the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts, The Ten, the Chicago Art Institute and the Corcoran Gallery of Washington; and the collection represents choices from these exhibitions supplemented by pictures secured direct from the artist's studios.

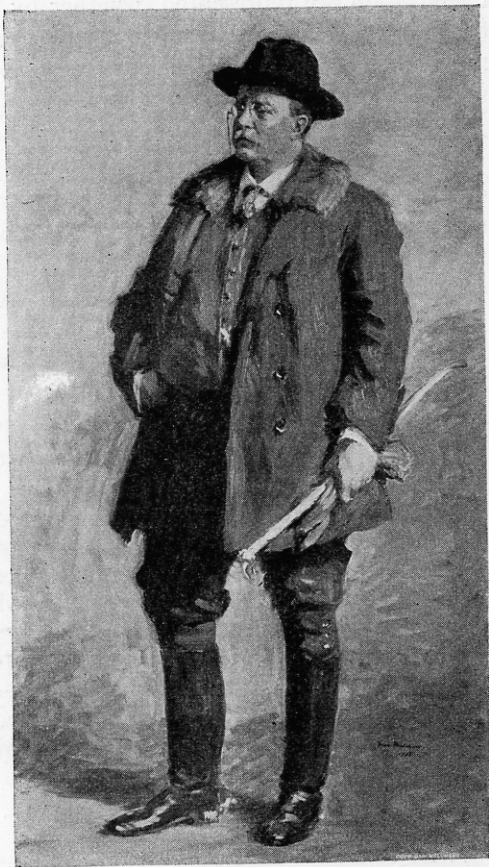
The Exhibition is sufficiently wide in scope to include the work of those artists who are striking out new paths; so that it represents originality in thought and treatment as well as approved methods of handling. It is thoroughly representative of painting in America today.

It is sufficient to say simply that artists send good pictures to those cities which prove good markets. The quality of the Annual Exhibitions in Detroit will be maintained at the highest point; but the size of these exhibitions and the readiness with which pictures can be secured from artists will depend largely on the sales made. A competent person is in charge of the sales, and is ready to give information and prices.

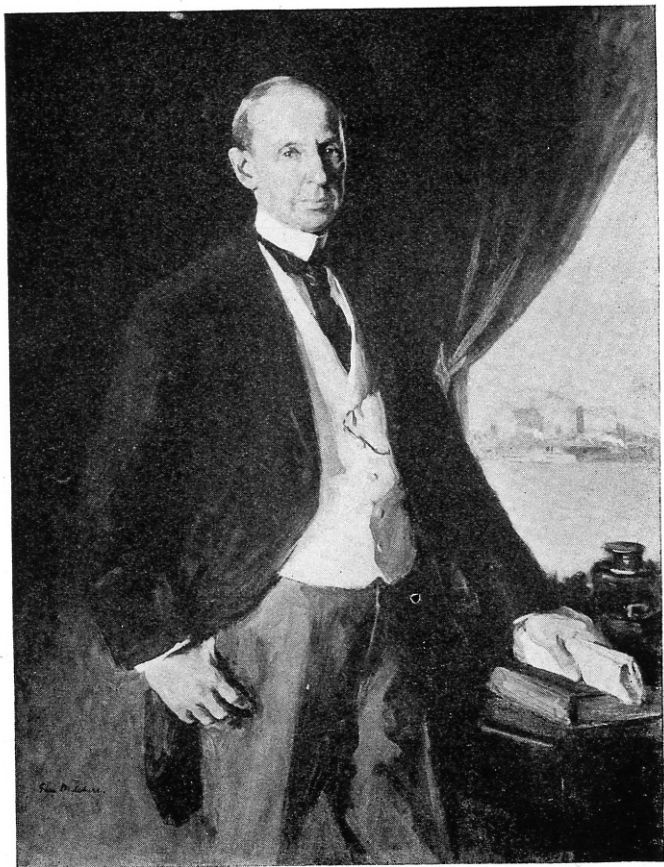

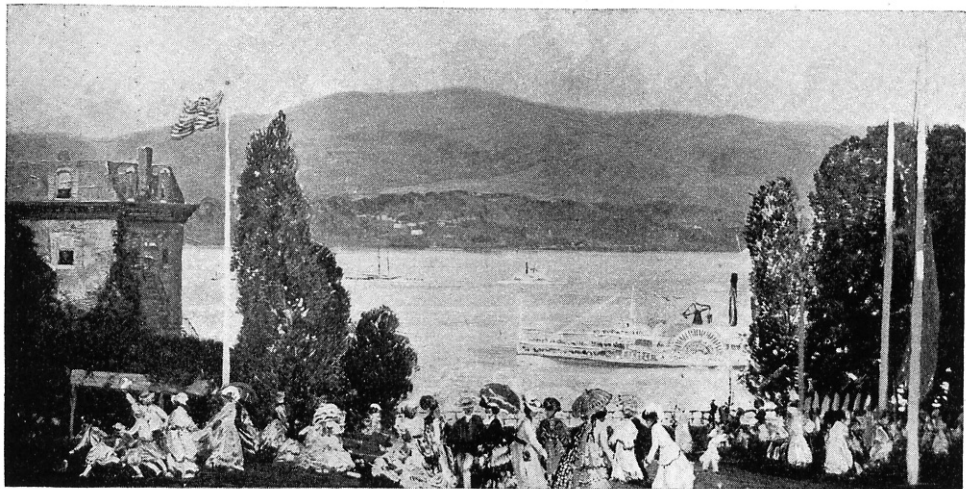
PORTRAIT, EX-PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT

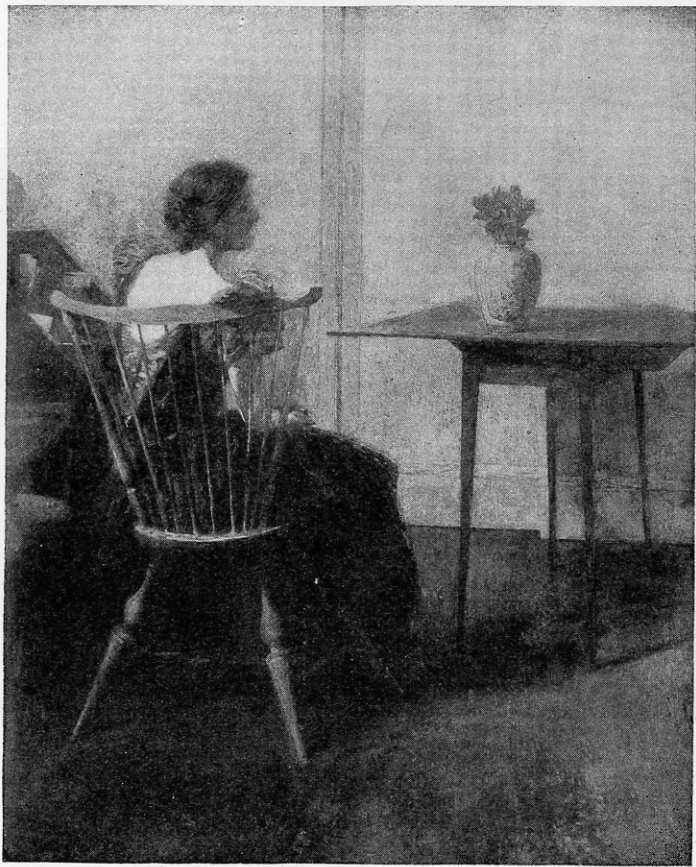


PORTRAIT OF THE LATE EDWARD C. WALKER, ESQ.

Mr. Walker was one of the original incorporators of the Museum, was President 1907-1909, and was one of the largest contributors to the permanent collection.

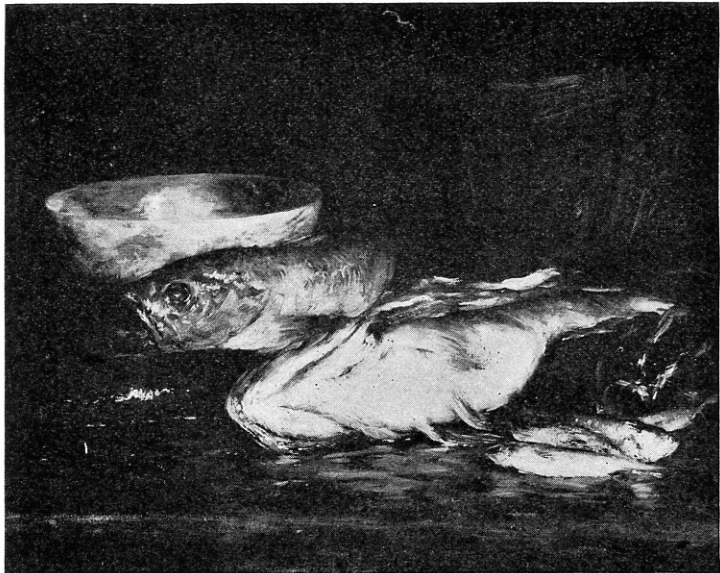


HUDSON RIVER HOLIDAY

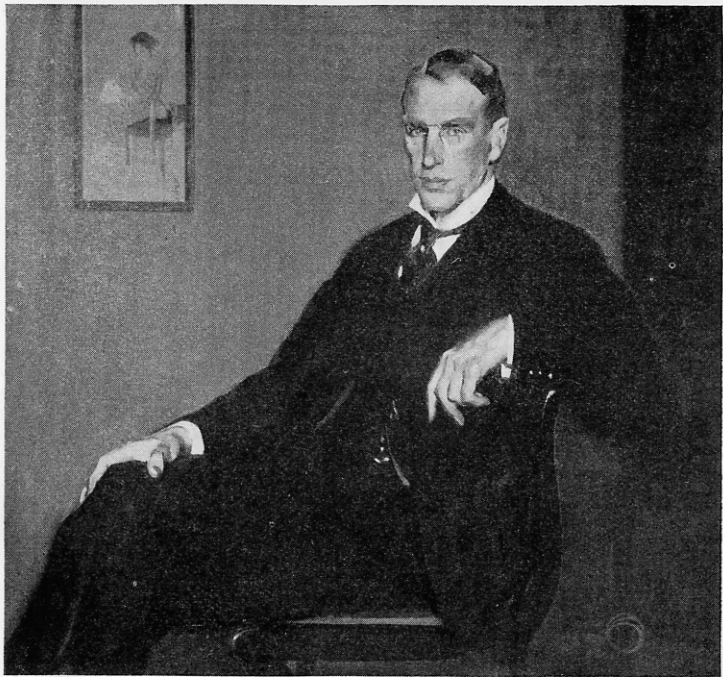


STILL LIFE—FISH

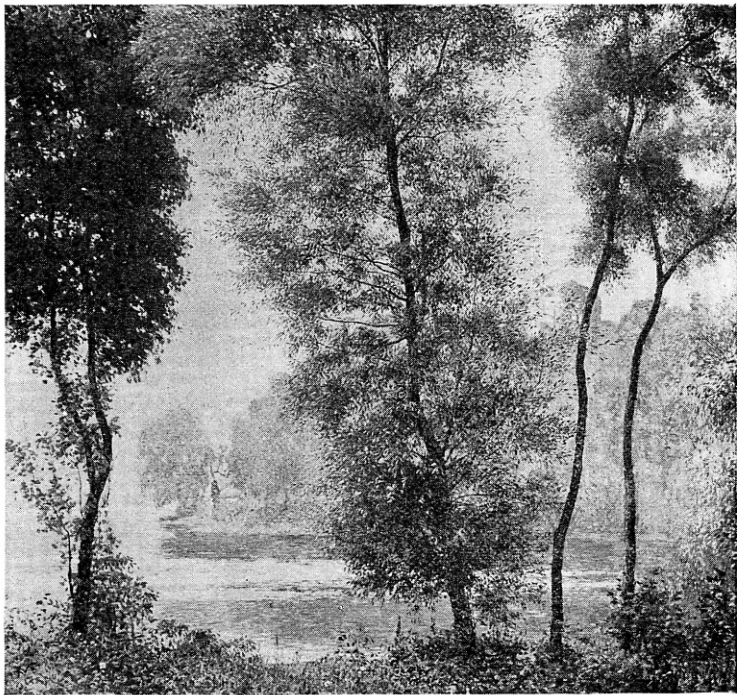

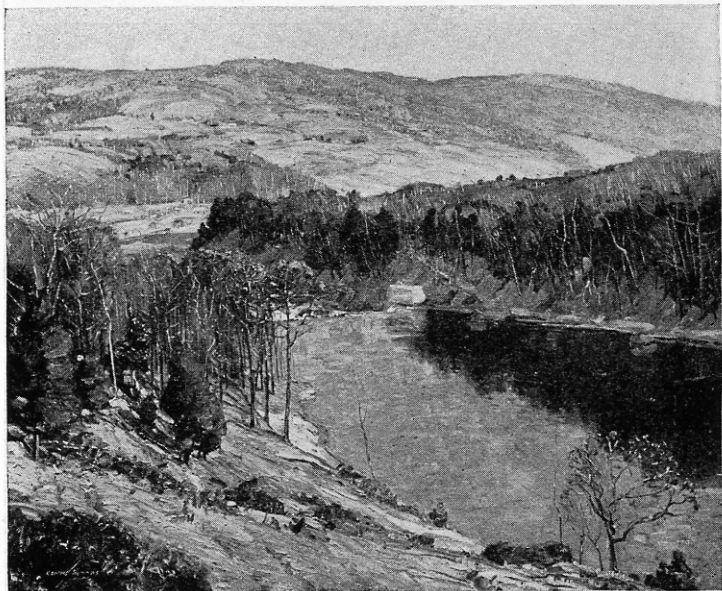

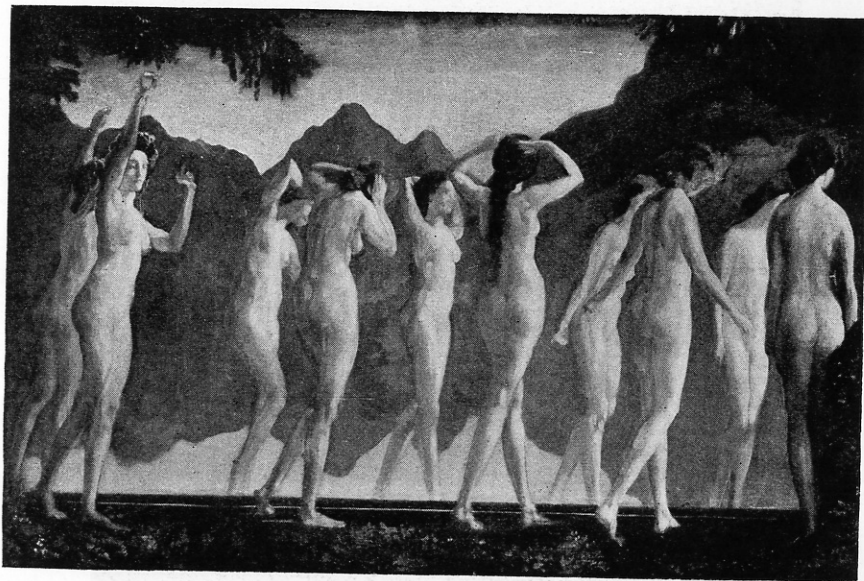
